Biography or Historical Sketch

Betty Mary Smith Goetting (1897 – 1980) worked as a librarian at the El Paso Public Library and later as the El Paso County Historical Society's first curator. In addition to her career in librarianship, she helped found the Planned Parenthood Center of El Paso, and actively promoted women's social, economic, and reproductive rights in the El Paso community.

Goetting was born in Jefferson, Texas in 1897. The Smith family moved to El Paso, Texas from Jefferson in 1910 and lived at 1009 Florence Street. Goetting attended Lamar Grade School and graduated from El Paso High School in 1915, where she wrote for *The Tattler* school publication. Starting in 1913, Goetting began working at the El Paso Public Library and became the protégé and close friend of head librarian, Maud Durlin Sullivan who noticed Goetting's love for books and history. Goetting left El Paso in 1917 to attend Riverside Library Service School. In 1918 she was appointed as assistant in the New York's Reference Library, and became involved in the women's suffrage movement. After returning to El Paso, she married Charles A. Goetting, who had volunteered and served with Major Richard Burges during World War I, in 1919. The Goettings had two sons, Charles A. Goetting Jr. and Kurt E. Goetting. During the 1920s Goetting, along with several other El Paso women, started a book club and later a history club under the guidance of Maud Sullivan.

Deeply interested in the birth control movement, Goetting began corresponding with birth control movement pioneer Margaret Sanger (1879 – 1966) and others about birth control education, family planning methods, and medical services for women in 1918. Goetting developed a close friendship with Sanger and the two frequently corresponded. In 1937 Goetting and Sanger, along with fifteen other women, six doctors, and several clergymen opened the El Paso Mothers' Health Center (later called Planned Parenthood Center of El Paso), and Goetting was named its first president. The Center faced much opposition from the Catholic Church and other individuals and groups. Despite this opposition, the Center saw 247 patients in its first six months, and from 1938 – 1939 the Center served 1140 patients. Services were originally limited to married women who could not otherwise afford medical care. In its early days the Center offered birth control, educational materials, and marital counseling. Goetting's involvement in the birth control movement continued after her term as president of the El Paso clinic. In 1938 Goetting retired as the Center's president, but was quickly named honorary president, and in 1950 and 1951 she was a member of the National Planned Parenthood Board.

Goetting also served in leadership positions in many El Paso civic and social organizations, such as the Woman's Club of El Paso, the El Paso Community Chest Council, and the El Paso County Historical Society, where she served as its curator for fifteen years. In 1932 she was commended as chairman of the El Paso Community Chest Council, Women's Division for her fundraising efforts. And during 1942 Goetting and Ms. J. Mott Rawling helped organize a special showing of "*Gone with the Wind*" for African-Americans, since El Paso

movie theaters were then segregated. She also participated in Pro Cathedral of St. Clements, Women's Committee of the El Paso Symphony Association, Daughters of the Confederacy, Daughters of the American Revolution, the El Paso Women's Chamber of Commerce, and was a charter member of the El Paso County Historical Society. In recognition of her many civic endeavors, women's rights activism, and participation in the birth control movement, Goetting received the Margaret Sanger Award in 1966. Other honors include the Planned Parenthood Center of El Paso Leadership Award (1968), the Presidential Award (1970) and the Paseña Valerosa (Courageous Woman) Award (1974) from the El Paso County Historical Society, recognition by the El Paso Women's Political Caucus as a Pioneer in Women's Rights (1977), and an honorary life membership from the El Paso Library Association (1979).

Series Description or Arrangement

The Betty Mary Smith Goetting papers are arranged in six series:

I. Biographical information

Series is arranged chronologically.

II. Planned Parenthood material

Series is arranged into four subseries (correspondence, clippings, publications, and other material) by type of material and then chronologically.

III. Other activities

IV. Margaret Sanger correspondence

Series is arranged chronologically.

V. Scrapbooks

Series is arranged chronologically. Personal scrapbook from about 1910 – 1918 was photographed and then taken apart and foldered, due to its poor condition.

VI. Photographs and other media

Series is arranged chronologically.

Scope and Content Notes

The Betty Mary Smith Goetting papers date 1910 – 1979, bulk 1937 – 1979. Types of records include correspondence, clippings, publications and other printed material, scrapbooks, recordings, and photographs. Arranged in six series (Biographical information, Planned Parenthood material, Other activities, Margaret Sanger correspondence, Scrapbooks, and Photographs and other media), these papers document Goetting's life and career, her relationship with Margaret Sanger, the Planned Parenthood Center of El Paso, and the birth control movement in El Paso and the United States.

The Biographical information series covers Goetting's family life, education, career in librarianship, honors, and women's rights activism. This series includes a short biography of Goetting. The Planned Parenthood material series documents the birth control movement from the 1920s to the 1970s, the history and activities of the Planned Parenthood Center of El Paso as well as national and international Planned Parenthood organizations. This series also contains various articles and publications of the birth control movement and Planned Parenthood and its supporters and critics. The Other activities series covers Goetting's activities outside of Planned Parenthood and mostly contains information about her participation in the El Paso History Club. The Margaret Sanger correspondence series includes correspondence primarily between Margaret Sanger and Betty Mary Smith Goetting, and are photocopies of the original letters. The Scrapbook series covers the Planned Parenthood Center of El Paso's history and activities, news about the birth control movement, and Goetting's involvement with Planned Parenthood. Loose materials in the scrapbooks were separated and foldered, while loose photographs in the scrapbooks were moved to the Photographs and other media series. The Photographs and other media series includes images of Betty Mary Smith Goetting, Margaret Sanger, other individuals involved in Planned Parenthood, and Planned Parenthood signs and exhibits. This series also contains several recordings (records) of Margaret Sanger's lectures and interviews from the 1950s.

Notes to the Researcher

Some of the Betty Mary Smith Goetting papers are fragile and brittle. Please handle with care. Photocopying of materials in poor condition might be restricted.

Box 13 contains original clippings and is placed at the end of the collection.

The 1910 – 1918 scrapbook was taken apart and foldered due to its extremely poor condition from dirt, dust, and mold damage. The scrapbook was photographed and digitized before it was dismantled. Researchers should use caution and wear a mask and rubber gloves when handling this scrapbook (boxes 12,14,15).
