- Is NAFTA bad for the USA?


The Pancho Villa Trade Treaty


Have Labor Market Conditions Worsened in the USA?

U.S. and Iowa Unemployment Rates






U.S. and El Paso Unemployment Rates


U.S. and New Mexico Unemployment Rates

















U.S. and Iowa Real Per Capita Income









Total U.S. Merchandise Trade





U.S. Merchandise Trade with Mexico









Agriculture and Manufacturing Employment





Real Value Added in the Manufacturing Sector




