Biographical Sketch

Lucille Ballew Pillow was born to Thomas Byrd Ballew and Amanda Lee (Arendell) Ballew on December 20, 1899 in Stephenville, Texas. Lucille attended Marfa High School and graduated in 1918. She went on to study at Tarleton State College, where she earned an associate degree in social work. After earning her degree, Lucille joined the American National Red Cross and worked for the military at Fort D.A. Russell in Marfa. Her parents owned and tended to a nearby ranch. Lucille was transferred to William Beaumont Hospital in El Paso, Texas when the military camp in Marfa closed down. In El Paso, Lucille met DeMoy Leon Pillow in 1921 while he was being treated at William Beaumont Hospital. Both attended Texas Western College during the 1920s. On April 7, 1923, Lucille and DeMoy married in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

D.L., as he was often called, was from a prominent family from Tennessee. After serving in WWI, he spent several years working for others. Later, D.L. decided to use his savings to open his own business – D.L. Pillow Company, where he sold office equipment during the 1930s. The Pillows often traveled and spent time in Europe, Mexico, Canada, and all over the United States. Additionally, they were frequently involved in service, social, community, and business activities.

In 1942, Lucille studied at Tulane University where she earned her master's degree in social work. Lucille spent much of her time helping others – she was well known in El Paso as a social worker. As a result of Lucille's wish to help others, she later joined the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) as a Welfare Officer. She worked overseas during World War II, helping displaced people.

Lucille taught sociology for three years at Texas Western College, now the University of Texas at El Paso. Lucille often donated money to the University of Texas at El Paso Library.

Throughout her life, Lucille participated in many community organizations, such as serving on the YWCA Board, as a Commissioner of the City of El Paso, on the Board of Directors of the Housing Authority, a board member of the El Paso County Unit of the American Cancer Society, and on the Women's Auxiliary of Providence Memorial Hospital. She also helped at Hotel Dieu School of Nursing and was involved with the American Association of University Women, Phi Alpha Theta, National Association of Social Work, International Association of Social Work, El Paso Community Concert Association, Daughters of the American Revolution, United Daughters of the Confederacy, Greater El Paso Chamber of Commerce, and other groups.

DeMoy Leon Pillow passed away on September 15, 1975. Lucille Pillow died on May 9, 1986, leaving her estate to the University of Texas at El Paso. On January 14, 1988, the D.L. and Lucille B. Pillow Library Fund was established in their honor.

Series Description or Arrangement

The Lucille B. Pillow papers are arranged in ten series:

Series I. Personal and Biographical, 1899-1988

Series is divided into three sub-series - Biographies, Birth and Marriage Certificate, Health Record, and Passports, and Awards and Honors Certificates. All sub-series are arranged chronologically.

Series II. DeMoy Leon Pillow, 1899-1975, undated

Series is divided into seven sub-series – Birth and Death Certificates, Health Record, and Passport, Career and Activities, Correspondence, Military, Awards and Honors Certificates, Funeral Record Memorial and Keepsakes, and Realia containing Lions Club plaques and World War I dog tags and a Victory medal. All sub-series are arranged chronologically.

Series III. Correspondence – General, 1921-1985, undated

Arranged chronologically.

Series IV. Newspaper clippings, 1949-1981, undated

Arranged chronologically.

Series V. Photographs and Other media, 1946-1975, undated

Series is divided into three sub-series – Photographs, Safety Film, and Negatives. All sub-series are arranged chronologically.

Series VI. Financial and Legal, 1954-1984

Arranged chronologically.

Series VII. Career, Community, and Professional Organizations and Activities, 1920-1985, undated

Series is divided into 11 sub-series – Resumes, Job Applications, and Memberships, Flyers and Pamphlets, United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA), El Paso Community Concert Association, American Association of University Women, University of Texas at El Paso Alumni Association, Pleasant View Home for Senior Citizens Board, National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution, United Daughters of the Confederacy, Friends of the University of Texas at El Paso, and Sociology Lecture Notes. All sub-series are arranged in chronologically order.

Series VIII. Exhibit and Ephemera, 1988, undated

Series is divided into two sub-series – Exhibit and Ephemera. All sub-series are arranged in chronologically order.

Series IX. Genealogy – Arendell-Arundell; Ballew-Balou-Ballou; Carter; Pillow, 1938-1985, undated

Series is divided into four sub-series – Family Coat of Arms (Arendell, Ballou, Carter, and Pillow), Correspondence and Research, Manuscripts, and Family Trees. All sub-series are arranged in chronological order, separated by surname.

Series X. Scrapbooks, 1925-1972

Series is kept in the original order that Lucille B. Pillow created. (See **Notes to Researcher**)

Scope and Content Notes

These papers help document Lucille B. Pillow's career as a social worker, contributions during World War I and World War II, and community service activities. The Lucille B. Pillow papers date from 1899 to 1988, bulk 1956-1985. Types of records include biographies, birth, marriage, and death certificates, awards and honors certificates, correspondence, funeral record and keepsakes, clippings, photographs, financial and legal documents, flyers and pamphlets, various books, sociology lecture notes, a guestbook and audiotape for the D.L. and Lucille B. Pillow Library Endowment Fund, plaques, dog tags, a victory medal, and scrapbooks. The scrapbooks contain clippings, correspondence, invitations, announcements, bulletins, photographs, name tags, postcards, programs, awards, greeting cards, a patch, and motivational prose.

The Personal and Biographical series contains copies of biographies on Lucille B. Pillow, birth and marriage certificates, health record-vaccination documentation, passports, awards and honors certificates Lucille earned throughout her life including

her diplomas and degree.

The DeMoy Leon Pillow series contains birth and death certificates, a health record letter, passport, Pillow-McMasters Office and School Equipment business cards, letters and certificates from the Mystic Shrine, Lions Club, Scottish Rite Freemasons, correspondence, military registration cards, American Red Cross registration card, honorable discharge papers, awards and honors certificates, funeral record and memorial or D.L. Pillow, Lions Club plaques, World War I dog tags (Pvt. Aero. Sqdn), and a World War I victory medal.

The Correspondence-General series contains personal and business letters, invitations, booklets of poems by Ida May Bond, and announcements from friends and family.

The Newspaper Clippings series consists of clippings from the *El Paso Herald-Post*, the *El Paso Times*, and *El Herald*. Some clippings are about El Paso artist Tom Lea.

The Photographs series includes photographs of Lucille and D.L., their family, and D.L. at his funeral. There are safety film copies from Ballew relatives, and negatives from D.L. Pillow's funeral.

The Financial and Legal series contains donation receipts to the University of Texas at El Paso Library Gift Fund, an El Paso Federal Savings and Loan Association operations report, an inventory of the Pillow estate, and a few drafts of Lucille B. Pillow's will.

The Career, Community, and Professional Organizations and Activities series includes resumes and job applications, membership forms, flyers and pamphlets, books, maps, correspondence, minutes, and gifts pertaining to the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA), Lucille's sociology lecture notes from when she taught at Texas Western College, and documents about the El Paso Community Concert Association, American Association of University Women, University of Texas at El Paso Alumni Association, Pleasant View Home for Senior Citizens Board, Daughters of the American Revolution, United Daughters of the Confederacy. This series also contains signed art from Jose Cisneros and the Friends of the University of Texas at El Paso.

The Exhibit and Ephemera series contains placards with information about D.L. and Lucille B. Pillow which were used on the display in the UTEP Library, and invitations, guestbook, and audiotape from the D.L. and Lucille B. Pillow Library Endowment Fund.

The Genealogy – Arendell, Ballew, Carter, and Pillow series contains correspondence, research, manuscripts, sketches of the family coat of arms (Arendell, Ballou, and Pillow), and family trees.

The Scrapbooks series contains two scrapbooks that contain clippings, photographs, correspondence, invitations, greeting cards, announcements, awards, motivational prose, and a woven patch.
