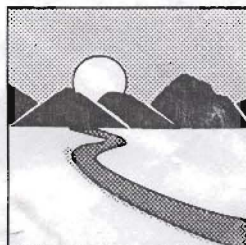

Chacón has been likened to a Chicano James Joyce. The New York Times says about the critically acclaimed publication, "Although a collection of short stories, [*Chicano Chicanery*] is really a 'Portrait of the Chicano Artist as a Young Man'."

Chacón served as the distinguished writer in residence at California State University, Fresno during the fall semester 2006. Aside from the highly successful short stories of *Chicano Chicanery* (2000) and the novel *and the shadows took him* (2004), Chacón has also been anthologized in such books as *Humor Me* (University of Iowa Press), *The Best Latin-American Erotic Fiction* (Berkeley Books), *Our Working Lives* (Bottom Dog Press), and *Floating Borderlands: 25 Years of Hispanic Literature* (University of Washington Press). He has stories and essays in such journals as The New England Review, Colorado Review, ZYZYVVA, and Callaloo.
